Calvary Public Hospital latest news from Father Tony Percy

John Howard – Prime Minister of Australia (1996-2007) – has entered the fray. In the midst of a recent book launch, he gave a spirited defense of property rights and religious freedom.

Issue 1 - A free and fair society defends the property rights of individuals and community groups. We must fight to ensure that what is happening with *Calvary Public Hospital* in the ACT does not happen again in Australia.

Issue 2 - The Constitution of Australia defends religious liberty. Section 116 of the Constitution says: No official religion. No compulsion in religion. No restriction on religion. No religious discrimination.

The most fundamental human right is the right to life. Then follows the right to search for, and adhere to, the meaning of life. Section 116 defends the right of Atheists, Agnostics, Jews, Muslims, Christians, Buddhists, Hindus, Seekers, etc., to search for the meaning of life. This right gives rise to many intermediary institutions, including medical and educational institutions. By its compulsory acquisition of Calvary Hospital, the ACT Government has trashed this fundamental human right. Spread the word. This is just the beginning, not the end. Fr Tony said to have reached nearly 45,000 signatures on the petition was beyond anyone's imagining. We have much to do and will let you know of our plans.
