Archdiocese Notice: Cost of each Priest in a parish in our Archdiocese – As a result of research with the Inner North parishes re-configuration, the following information is being offered to all parishes in the Archdiocese. This research coincides with a serious downward trend across the Archdiocese for the First Collection (Presbytery Account - that goes to the Central Presbytery Fund from which all our priests are paid). The 2024 financial breakdown is:

\$19,000 Stipend (wage)

\$12,000 Housekeeping

\$ 2,500 Health Insurance (\$2000-\$3000)

\$18,000 Sustentation based on \$90K pa for first collection (supports the Archbishop's ministries)

\$ 4,500 CRF Levy based on \$90K pa for first collection

\$ 1,000 Sabbatical leave levy

\$ 9,600 Car

\$18,000 Presbytery costs: Electricity/Gas/Utilities

\$ 2,090 Superannuation

\$86,690 Total

Happy New Year! Yes, it is a new year within the Church. With the first Sunday of Advent, the Church begins a new liturgical cycle of the year. This year is the Liturgical cycle of Year B.
