

Reflection on the Gospel - Desperation and Faith

Jairus is a desperate father: His dignity is cast aside; his longing is expressed in his whole body fallen at the feet of Jesus. Such is the quality of his desperation. Jesus says nothing, he promises nothing. His action speaks for itself – he goes with Jairus. And the crowd presses forward into the new drama.

Out of the press of people a woman comes up behind Jesus. She suffers from an incurable haemorrhage, an affliction that makes her, and anyone she touches, ritually unclean. She had already exhausted all attempts at a cure, and her treatments have exhausted her savings. She is all spent. She jostles her way through the crowd, hoping that if she can touch Jesus' clothes, that contact will be enough. Such is the quality of her desperation. Such is the quality of her faith in the power of Jesus.

Consider an "unredeemable" aspect of your life: a broken relationship, an unhealed wound, an unshakable temptation. Imagine yourself as one who clutches at the clothes of Jesus asking to be saved.

Make your request as confidently as the people in today's gospel.
