SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

In 2000 Pope John Paul II declared the Second Sunday of Easter to be 'Divine Mercy Sunday'. In doing so he drew on the life and writings of Polish Sister Faustina Kowalska. His decision was not without its critics. They would have it that the celebration of Easter Sunday and the Octave of Easter cannot and should not be 'topped up', whatever the merits of one of the faithful close to the pope's experience and spirituality. Easter is the stand alone highpoint of God's mercy. It is noteworthy that the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference have acknowledged but not promoted 'Divine Mercy' Sunday, while recognising the value of the 'Divine Mercy' devotion for some. Closer to home, we note that other than when it falls on a Sunday, 28 April is the Feast of St Peter Chanel. Peter Chanel was a young French Marist priest sent to the Pacific island of Fotuna. The enthusiastic embrace of the Catholic faith by the locals concerned Nuiliki, the local leader who had Chanel clubbed to death. What is not disputed is that in quite diverse circumstances Sr Faustina and Fr Peter were dedicated to the life and teachings of Jesus. Current reflection

on our community's well-being in the light of the life and teachings of Jesus has seen the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference (ACBC) and Catholic Social Services Australia (CSSA) release statements pending the 18 May federal election (https://mediablog.catholic.org.au). The CSSA statement affirms "the inherent dignity of individuals and families", and calls for "adequate income and social services for low-income and vulnerable families, a Job Guarantee Program to create a full employment economy, support for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in their pursuit of constitutional recognition and the resettlement of all asylum seekers and refugees currently on Nauru and Manus Island to Australia." The ACBC base their statement, "Politics in the service of peace" on the four pillars of Catholic Social Teaching, namely, the dignity of the human person, the common good, subsidiarity and solidarity. Archbishop Mark Coleridge, ACBC President notes that "we all have a role in promoting peace — which means speaking to our fellow Australians with love not hate, with respect not contempt, with understanding not indifference."

Acknowledging our different personalities and backgrounds, and therefore diverse spiritualities, we gather as the 'community of communities' for liturgical celebration at Sunday Mass. We then go from this 'source and summit' experience to live the Gospel. At least that is the call of a consistent Catholic faith practice and ethic of life. We often 'miss the mark' but continue as a pilgrim people, humbled but wiser as we seek to follow the risen Lord. We pray that those young parishioners who this week commence their proximate preparation for First Eucharist would be formed by this understanding and experience in their families and in our parish and school communities.
