SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Today we celebrate that our God is one yet three. I know, sounds crazy. However the understanding of the Bible is that God has self-revealed as Creator, Saviour and Sanctifier or Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Yet these descriptors are inadequate to the mystery of God. Fr Brendan Byrne SJ speaks of the early Church sensing that their communion with the Father in Jesus was so strong that, "eventually, they came to recognise it as involving a third divine person." This sense of the triune yet one God "was not a remote heavenly mystery, let alone an arid theological puzzle, but a way of expressing the Christian sense of being drawn into the divine communion of love." In this awareness "they found the impulse and the energy to be instruments of the saving outreach of that love into the world." And so we understand the Church to be both communion and mission in Christ. Today we pray with and for those young parishioners who gather with their families to celebrate their First Holy Communion. May the nurturing of their faith and potential at home and school be regularly nourished by gathering with and partaking of the Body of Christ so as to be the Body of Christ. We also hope that the formulation of the Six

National Themes for Discernment of the Plenary Council (which arose from the almost 17,500 submissions received between May 2019 and March 2019) will assist us through prayer and reflection to be a Christ-centred Church that is: Missionary and Evangelising; Inclusive, Participatory and Synodal; Prayerful and Eucharistic; Humble, Healing and Merciful; A Joyful, Hope-filled and Servant Community; Open to Conversion, Renewal and Reform.
