JUST TALKING OR WALKING THE TALK

We speak of being made in God's image and likeness. Hold that thought. Today's readings focus on the generosity of God. The 'Parables of the Lost' each elicit a response that is 'over the top': the shepherd leaves the ninety-nine in search of the lost sheep, the woman turns her house upside down in search of the lost coin and the father runs to greet the son who in effect had wished him dead. Jesus tells these parables against those who criticise him for eating with sinners. "The behaviour, response and attitude of the person who loses something precious images the behaviour, response, and attitude of God towards human beings "lost" through sin" (Brendan Byrne SJ). No, we are not God but our attitude and actions as disciples calls for a generosity of spirit and action. I say that mindful of the young parishioners who this week will be Confirmed by Archbishop Christopher; may they mature as 'intentional disciples'. I say that in welcoming Cathy Ransom, Archdiocesan Missions Office Director on this Mission Sunday. Cathy will share something of her work as she seeks our support to share the generosity of God. Back to being made in the image and likeness of God. We can respond like St Paul who acknowledged God's unmerited goodness and shared the same for the sake of true human flourishing (Second Reading), or we can draw within like the hard-hearted older son who could

not accept the generosity of his father. Living faith is manifest in the fruit produced, outward righteousness comes up short if challenged.
