SOCIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY: Shane Dwyer, Director of the National Centre for Evangelisation and the Catholic Enquiry Centre reminds us: "Jesus Christ is God expressed in human form . . . this, then, tells us that now and for all time, the spiritual (God) finds its home in the physical (world). We cannot live an authentic Catholic life while somehow artificially separating our faith from our day-to-day lives." Following the publication of Pope Leo XIII's Rerum Novarum (1891) which addressed workers' rights in the industrial age, a body of Catholic social teaching has developed. The 1970 Synod of Bishops declared that social justice was "a constitutive dimension of the Gospel", founded, Pope John Paul II said on "the threefold principles of human dignity, solidarity and subsidiarity". The 2019 – 2020 Social Justice Statement of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, 'Making It Real' addresses engagement with our digital world. Bishop Terry Brady comments: "Listening to people in parishes, I hear that it is often the desire to keep in touch with far flung family and friends that draws us to social media. Our parishes, schools and other Catholic organisations have been quick to embrace positive possibilities for communication and connection, and Pope Francis himself encourages us to 'boldly become citizens of our digital world'." Brady goes on to note that the digital world "can also be a place of manipulation, exploitation and violence . . . at their heart, these problems are not technological, but rather moral. We can choose how we behave online, and we can collectively shape the

online world, building a more just and loving neighbourhood." I encourage you to pick up a copy of the Statement or the summary 'Ten Steps' pamphlet as you leave. The points raised would make for interesting discussion.
