TO PERSIST IN PRAYER

Persistence in prayer is the obvious message in today's First Reading and Gospel. But what should we pray for? The prayer of many is for a better world where justice and peace reign. Highly commendable. But is that it? A quick search on Doctor Google reveals that contrary to many media reports things are improving: in the last thirty years 25% of the world's population have risen beyond extreme poverty though 10% still do survive on less than \$2 per day; childhood mortality from preventable causes –poverty, hunger and disease – is less than half what it was thirty years ago; 86% of the world's population is literate; and, in relative terms, we live in perhaps "the most peaceable time in our species existence (Cook, 2013). The vast majority of the world's population claim religious adherence, though there is a decline in the same amongst the young especially in first world countries. On Monday I attended the Parliamentary Christian Fellowship Breakfast held in the Great Hall on the hill. The Governor-General, the Prime Minister and the Leader of the Opposition all variously shared something of the need for humble openness to the divine. Under King David the Chosen People never had it so good. In many ways that is true for us. However they got their priorities wrong; their vision was limited. Ours can be too. Our First Reading affirms the fidelity of Moses in delivering the Chosen People. The Gospel sees Jesus call for persistence in prayer as we await the fullness of the Kingdom of God. While the move to a more just world has in large measure had a religious motivation, might we never reduce a religious response to quantifiable improvement but rather let it begin and end in acknowledgement and gratitude to God. In the light of that

relationship we are called to prayerfully see one another anew and to hold together often competing values in terms of what truly fosters human development. The need for religious freedom underpins and affirms all human values rather than sees them relativised in a populist manner. In the words of the then Secretary-General of the UN, Dag Hammarskjold, "For all that has been, Thanks. To all that shall be, Yes!"
