LOOKING AHEAD AND PREPARING FOR

The Season of Advent is two-fold. We initially look to the future consummation of the Lord's salvation. We have renewed internal relationship with the Lord but there is some way to go in terms of the fruits of that salvation, namely justice, peace and harmony for all and between all. As we move into the second part of Advent, our attention turns to the preparation for Christmas and the hope of the people of the Old Testament for the Messiah. *"So, despite our belief that the Messiah has come, we long for the (second) coming of the Saviour as the people of the Old Testament longed for the first" (Brendan Byrne SJ)*. Advent is about waiting and longing, mindful of what God has done and is doing. Our hope for a harmonious future is reflected in the First Reading from Isaiah. The vision is of all *"the nations coming to the mountain of the Temple of the Lord . . . hammering their swords into ploughshares"* in a new world order of peace. The Second Reading and Gospel move to more personal and immediate considerations; be focused and be prepared. St Paul calls the people of Rome not to succumb to prevailing norms but to live in the light of the Risen Lord. In the Gospel, Jesus urges his listeners to have a keen eye and ear for the Lord, mindful that he seeks engagement each day. Will we be ready? To prepare our hearts and minds, the Church encourages us to celebrate the Sacrament

of Reconciliation (see local times below); to put off that which hinders and to put on that which reflects a sensitivity and readiness to respond. Of course, the busyness of this time of year can be contrary to the focus we seek. *Lord, help me to retain balance and perspective in these days, enjoying that which is life-giving and to be savoured but ever mindful that it is only in you that my deepest desires are addressed.*
