OPEN TO THE SIGNIFICANCE OF CHRISTMAS

John the Baptist was a 'straight shooter'. Without fear or favour he called people to moral renewal. Like his peers, he understood the coming Messiah to be vengeful. He drew a line in the sand and said you best decide which side you are on. Yet later in prison and perhaps confused by what he had heard, John sends his disciples to inquire whether Jesus was the Messiah. Jesus responds by citing and expanding on the passage from Isaiah in our First Reading; the blind see, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear. Hardly a vengeful warrior king. John prepared the way for Jesus but the Way was quite different to what he presumed. Further, those who later received the message of Jesus in all its fullness are for that very reason considered 'greater' than John, though he is acknowledged as the greatest of the prophets. With what concept of Jesus do I approach this Christmas? The toll of the drought, the devastation of the bushfires and the impact of the NZ volcanic eruption call us to see that he whom we celebrate as 'one with us' or Emmanuel is present in the weary farmer, the exhausted firefighter, the deceased, the injured and the grieving. Or perhaps we only still see a baby in a nativity scene and all is good for me and mine. Who doesn't like a baby! Sentiment and the commercialisation of the same are one thing but the significance of the one whose coming we celebrate is far more profound and enduring. And today, Gaudate Sunday we light our pink advent wreath candle and anticipate the joy of Christmas morning: "Joyful all you nations rise, Join the triumph of the skies, With the angelic host proclaim, Christ is born in Bethlehem."
