### ONE IN, ALL IN

**On Friday I heard a radio report suggesting that the Boxing Day Test at the MCG might be moved to November or March when the weather will not be as hot. Change is nothing new. Indeed it is a constant of life. So too is continuity.** Reading a Christmas gift of Bill Bryson's **'The Body'** I was taken with how our very existence is a matter of continuity. *"All of the components of the genome have one single-minded purpose – to keep the line of your existence going. It's a slightly humbling thought that the genes you carry are immensely ancient and possibly – so far, anyway – eternal. You will die and fade away, but your genes will go on and on so long as you and your descendants continue to produce offspring. And it is surely astounding to reflect that not once in the three billion years since life has begun has your personal line of descent been broken. For you to be here now, every one of your ancestors had to successfully pass on its genetic material to a new generation before being snuffed out or otherwise sidetracked from the procreative process. That's quite a chain of success."* **Today's Feast of the Holy Family affirms that which underpins the birth of Jesus and the Christmas Season: it is God's initiative seeking a human response.** Joseph is front of stage as he responds to God's directions in a dream and so safeguards the Holy Family. Matthew portrays Jesus as the new Moses; both are born under threat of being murdered, both flee and later return under God's direction (cf. Ex 1, 2, 4:19). Moses matures and leads the people from slavery. Jesus will mature and lead all to new life. God's initiative still seeks a response from us in our families and in the wider family of our communities. Might our experience of family over these days remind of us how blessed and in some ways challenged we are by 'our mob'. In the midst of the joys and sorrows of family our God beckons, no less than he did Moses and Joseph. We are all part of a continuing and evolving journey.

I take this opportunity to express my gratitude for Christmas greetings, cards and gifts from you, the family of faith I am privileged to serve. May we all continue to grow in faith, hope and love. Fr John
