TOGETHER IN TRAGEDY

Devastating bushfires have impacted our nation at a time of unprecedented drought. Large parts of the beautiful Coastal Deanery of our Archdiocese (from Batemans Bay to the Victorian border) are reeling as they count the cost. Fires in the Monaro and Western Deaneries are being carefully monitored. The lingering smoke haze, the images of flames and those distressed in front of their fire ravaged homes have evoked memories of the 2003 Canberra bushfires. The heroic feats of firefighters and stories of communities supporting each other remind us of our potential for compassion and solidarity. We are in this together. Today's celebration of the Epiphany is timely. In the darkness, the Magi were led to the baby born in a manger. The best of human knowledge and wisdom deferred to the child born to bring peace and goodwill within and between all. Today's liturgical celebration and the bushfires remind us that "all" refers to all creation; it is all connected and we are all connected. As Pope Francis reminded us in his encyclical, 'Laudato Si' (2015) we must respect an inclusive ecology if we are, as the subtitle of the encyclical notes, to 'Care for Our Common Home'. An integrated approach affirms the giftedness of all and the need to share for the sake of all, not just for a few and not just for short term gain. We are stewards not masters of the natural order. Like the Magi we kneel in humble awareness before the one who is Way, Truth and Life for all. As the Body of Christ and with all people of good will we pray for those slowly putting their lives in some order and for those who are assisting them, we acknowledge the everyday heroes variously coordinating and implementing a measured response to the fires, we commit to practical support for devastated communities and we pray for humble openness to God's Spirit on the part of those elected to serve in a manner befitting the magnitude of the issues.
