### PERSPECTIVE

Friend and retired Melbourne priest Fr Mal Crawford reflected recently, "Life is like a relay race - you do your lap as well as you can and hand the baton to your successor and depart gently." The bushfires will become a part of our story. Hopefully, we will pass on insight and wisdom from the experience more attuned to the rhythms of nature and community. After all, fire destroys and symbolically purifies. Living in love and attentive to truth affords us perspective and purpose in the midst of change wherein God's Spirit calls. As we reflected last week and today's Gospel further spells out, John the Baptist was not, contrary to the opinion of some, the 'main game'. Jesus was. Tradition had it that the present figures in salvation history would defer to those of the past. John defers to Jesus who comes after him. And the significance of Jesus will only be fully manifest in his dying and rising. In other words, it is only at the end of the Gospel, or the end of the Easter cycle that we will truly grasp why John points to Jesus as "the one who is going to baptise with the Holy Spirit." It is noteworthy that John claimed not to know Jesus but to reveal him. Sometimes our personal experience of God is not great. Sometimes it is an experience of absence. The notions of faith, hope and love are not then notional but challenging in the very fibre of our being. Yet if we remain true and open as John did to his mission, God's presence can break through in ways unforeseen. St Teresa of Calcutta was revered for her commitment to the Gospel but for many years despite her prayer and good works she experienced a spiritual aridity. Perhaps that experience gave rise to her commenting: "Be faithful in small things because it is in them that your strength lies." Or

again, "We ourselves feel that what we are doing is just a drop in the ocean. But the ocean would be the less because of that missing drop." Fr John
