#### LENT: SEASON OF OPENNESS

The Season of Lent began with the distribution of ashes last Wednesday. Lent is a time of 'stepping aside' (for personal prayer), of 'letting go' (through fasting) and 'reaching out' (in acts of charity, especially through Project Compassion). In other words, Lent is a time of 'repentance'; a time to turn and be guided anew by the Spirit's light to the celebration of our new life in Christ over Holy Week-Easter. On Ash Wednesday Pope Francis said that Lent was "the right time to turn off the television and open the Bible. It is time to turn off mobile phones and connect ourselves to the Gospel." In a veiled reference to social media he said, "It is time to give up useless words, idle chatter, rumours, gossip" and speak intimately with the Lord. The late Jean Vanier was revered as manifesting the life of the Risen Christ. The founder of L'Arche for intellectually disabled adults, which today has 154 communities (including one in our parish) in 38 countries, was last week outed for sexually abusing several women, all adults and none disabled. The editorial of La Croix International noted: "It is difficult to accept that this much admired man committed such evil. But the good he taught us – the way he changed our attitudes to the disabled – is still good. We must try now to continue doing the good work, by keeping our eyes open to our own fragility in the face of evil." Individually and collectively we are a mixed lot, often succumbing to "our own fragility in the face of evil." The Season of Lent calls us to acknowledge that. May our humble openness to the Spirit purge that which clings and hinders, and move us to prayerfully and otherwise support

one another. To assist our Lenten journey, we welcome John and Joan Warhurst who at all Masses this weekend will address the work of Caritas and this year's Project Compassion Appeal under the theme, 'Go Further Together'. As you know, the Australian Church calls us to fast and abstinence on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, all other Fridays of Lent and throughout the year being days of penance. The law of fasting obliges those aged between 18 and 60 and the law of abstinence (from meat) obliges those 15 and older. Locally, besides the alternate celebration of Stations of the Cross or Exposition from 7 – 7.30pm on Tuesdays 3, 10, 17, 24 and 31 March, with our parish hosting the Rite of Reconciliation for parishioners of Weston Creek and North and South Woden on Wednesday, 8 April, there are copies in the foyer of Fr. Ron Rolheiser's OMI 'Daybreaks, Daily Reflections for Lent and Easter' (gold coin/s donation Fr John requested).
