CONSTANTS IN THE MIDST OF CHANGE

Happy Mothers' Day! Attached is a blessing for mothers and a heartfelt comment of Pope Francis. May our mums know our gratitude and if deceased our prayerful remembrance.

We celebrate the gift of motherhood in what are referred to as unprecedented times. These are unprecedented times for us but they have antecedents in Australia's history. Just over 100 years ago the 'Spanish Flu' pandemic of 1918-1919 saw the closing of churches in Australia. Earlier we had the situation in the colony of NSW where for decades the ministry of priests was denied Catholics until the arrival in Sydney 200 years ago on 3 May 1820 of Fr Joseph Therry and Fr Philip Conolly. Fr Conolly left for Tasmania within the year while Fr Therry worked tirelessly in Sydney and travelled on horseback to remote communities. Their work built on and supported the faith commitment of layfolk who had managed without the ministry of priests. Of course, it was not and is not a matter of 'either, or' but rather 'both, and'.

We acknowledged this last week, Good Shepherd Sunday and World Day of Prayer for Vocations. Yes, we need the ministry of more priests and the witness of religious (see attached 'Prayer For Vocations') but the particular call of a relative few must arise from a sense of all being called, all having a vocation. Today's Gospel emphasises the point. Jesus promises that all who follow him – the presence of God amongst us – will have the very life of God, now and in God's 'house' forever. Jesus is the mediator. He is both at one with the Father and with us. "Jesus explains, he himself is 'the Way' to the revelation of the Father (the 'Truth'), in which is contained the gift of '(eternal) life' ('the Life')" (Brendan Byrne SJ). Pope Francis recently reminded us that our Christian life is not elitist and exclusive. It is loving and life-giving relationship in community. As a mother gives life and nurtures it so that her child might reach their potential within community, so our life in Christ finds expression in community. Our personal and communal relationships have been challenged these days and we have taken stock and refocused. In challenging times our character is first revealed and then developed by the experience. A question I put to myself and share with you is: "What insights have I come

to about myself and our community as a result of the pandemic?" Further, "How will I translate those insights when life returns to the so-called normal?"

A return to the life as we knew it is being signalled by the return of Catholic schools from 18 May. More broadly, there will be a gradual easing of restrictions, including the opening of churches, based on a balancing of expert medical advice and the socio-economic imperatives for people to work and to gather. Talk of schools prompts me to ask for your prayerful intercession for them. They have been under the pump and have come through very well. Our Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) has sent our two parish school communities a letter of affirmation for their efforts. Again, the discernment of where God's Spirit is calling the Australian Church through the postponed Plenary Council prompts me to seek your prayerful intercession for these intentions.

Finally, mindful that many are now familiar with the online streaming of Masses and the ubiquitous 'Zoom' meeting, I was hoping that you might have some suggestions as to **how the parish might employ these technologies.** Any thoughts and how you might possibly assist to implement them could be forwarded to the parish office. *Fr John*
