### **PROPHETS SPEAK THE TRUTH IN LOVE**

Many no longer trust the Church. The sexual abuse of innocent children and the church governance that did not address the problem have seen many say enough is enough. So too those who despair of the hierarchical Church truly engaging with the aspirations of women and their giftedness, enough is enough. A perceived intransigence on issues of sexual identity and denial of Eucharistic hospitality to some have been bridges too far for others. Of course the Church does not simply set its sails according to cultural imperatives. At the same time, some are not open to the subtle movement of the Spirit to enrich our living tradition.

Scriptural prophets did not as such predict the future. Rather they pointed to the consequences of the people not respecting their covenant relationship as God's people. Jeremiah was a reluctant prophet. He did not want to be ostracised for telling his fellow-citizens of their fate. Nonetheless he trusted in God (First Reading) and would have identified with the understanding that "those who stand firm in witness to the Gospel and the values it enshrines, even to the point of death, can be confident that their ultimate fate lies in the hand of God who will one day be vindicated" (Brendan Byrne SJ).

To stand firm in the face of opposition from 'the world' is one thing. It is quite something else to face insidious opposition within the family of faith. Pope Francis has had to do so. He has not responded to his critics as such but rather fostered ongoing dialogue. He promotes a 'synodal' (or 'walking together') Church. A Church where we draw on the riches of our tradition as together, and sometimes in robust dialogue, we seek where the movement of the Holy Spirit is calling us 'in Christ'. Only those who exclude themselves do not have a place at the table. This approach seeks encounter and dialogue with other religious traditions and all people of good will. This approach does not undermine the hierarchy but rather enhances it consistent with the call of all the baptised to share in the mission of the Church and for the Church to discern the movement of the Spirit in the 'signs of the times'. True to the vision of the Second Vatican Council, it is this understanding that underpins the postponed Plenary Council which will now be held over 3-10 October 2021 and 4-9 July 2022.

The Church draws on the experience of Jeremiah in our First Reading to situate today's Gospel from Matthew. We read that the persecuted early church is called to fear not just him who can destroy the body but the soul as well. His audience were comforted and challenged by their relationship with Jesus who brings life in the face of persecution and even death. "This is a Gospel which readily illustrates the adage that Christianity is comforting but not comfortable. . . [Matthew] presents Jesus as insisting that the Gospel is not something to be talked about and lived behind closed doors. It – and the values it enshrines – demands public witness and proclamation. . . The challenge for Christians not currently living in such situations will be to question a far too easy symbiosis between discipleship and surrounding cultural mores" (Byrne). And to be clear: those mores can be ecclesial as well as cultural. In union with Jesus, and after the example of Jeremiah and Pope Francis, we too are called to speak and live the truth in love. *Fr John*
