THE HARVEST IS MORE THAN MATERIAL

Today's Gospel speaks of an extravagant sower. Seeds are spread here and there. In some instances no crop results. In rich soil the seed produces big time, thirty, sixty, even one hundred fold. The latter is somewhat reflected in stimulus measures of governments in response to the pandemic. They have spread money in the hope of stimulating the economy as businesses, families and individuals have had to tighten their budgets. The challenges are ongoing and we are unsure just when it will end. The early church faced persecution not a pandemic. But the result was not dissimilar: concern if not fear and the need to persevere in the hope of better days ahead. Our concern for material well-being is understandable and must be addressed. But what is the vision we bring to the table? Is the common good found only in material well-being? Pope Francis has called for Vatican agencies to prepare the future in contrast to preparing us for the future. The former affirms capacity and a vision, the latter reflects individualism and coping as best you can. What do we need to address as individuals and as communities as we prepare the future? Fr Augusto, from the Vatican's Dicastery for Human Development in a recent video conference stated, "We need a new economic model, not because I say so or Pope Francis is asking for one.... We need a new model because there's no alternative. Within the catastrophe of the pandemic [we see] people dying; people sick; countries forced to close because they cannot control the spread of the virus; people growing nervous because they can't take it any more; poor people who have to go to work because they don't receive a salary from either the private or public sectors. . . . Seeing all this calamity, we acknowledge that every crisis is an opportunity to see what's not working." If our lives and our communities are the soil within which God's Spirit moves, what might need to be tilled or broken open for me to be receptive? What is needed for the common good now and longer term? It is in this sense that the Church speaks of 'a consistent ethic of life'. It is a recognition that all is connected and that God's Spirit moves in and through it all and the mission of the Church is to be both 'a sign and instrument' of that movement. How might I be that 'sign and instrument' of life, love and truth? Dare I suggest that the issue is not how bad it is but how good it might be? And so back to today's Gospel message for the early Church to stay the distance in view of a promised harvest beyond their wildest imaginings. As Archbishop Thomas Wenski from the U.S Conference of Catholic Bishops Committee for Religious Liberty has noted, "The right to religious freedom has its foundation in the very dignity of the human person. Religious freedom is the human right that guarantees all other rights – peace and creative living together will only be possible if freedom of religion is fully respected."
