A SAVVY FARMER

Today's Gospel continues from Matthew 13. As with last week's reading (the sower and the seed), the parables today address the nature of the kingdom of God. If, as Jesus maintains, the kingdom has dawned (Matt 4:17; 12:28), why is there evil present in the world, in the Church and in individuals? Darnel (a weed representative of the evil one) and wheat (representative of God's goodness) grow together but God, here portrayed as a savvy farmer, will have the last laugh. *"He knows that the wheat is strong enough to tolerate the weeds' competition for nutrition and irrigation. After the harvest the landowner will not only have grain for his barns, but extra, unanticipated fuel for his needs. Instead of shaming this landowner, the weed strategy has backfired and shamed the enemy . . . In a society dedicated to revenge, the landowner's victory by seeming to do nothing is a powerful lesson" (John J. Pilch). Perhaps we are still slow learners. As Brendan Byrne SJ notes: "Christianity's long history of intolerance – the Inquisition, etc – shows the tragedy and folly of being more zealous to root out evil than to encourage good. Jesus seems to suggest that God can cope for quite some time with the continuing existence of evil in order to preserve or promote a wider good."*

On the other hand the Gospel speaks of **'hell-fire'** as the destination for those who persist in evil. As with the parables, this is to be understood allegorically rather than literally: to persist in evil is self-destructive and the final judgement of God will confirm that. Conversely, and again allegorically, the allusion to the **mustard seed** and to the **leaven** calls to mind the power of faith and virtue to manifest new life. As with the bountiful crop of last week – thirty, sixty, even a hundredfold – the potential is big time.

Writing in the 'City News' recently, Bishop Pat Power was asked to address "Is there a Christian future?" His response in part is pertinent to today's Gospel. "REMEMBERING is a vital part of our faith-life: to recall those times when we have personally experienced God's love, often through the kindness and care of others; the times when we have been confronted by seemingly insurmountable problems, but eventually not only survive but even grow in the process. When the Second Vatican Council dealt with atheism in the mid-1960s it accused believers of causing people to turn away from God because of the inconsistencies in their own life. How alarmingly true is that today with the terrible scandals emerging around child sexual abuse and other forms of abuse. This is particularly pertinent to the Catholic Church which historically has placed so much emphasis on sexual morality only to fail dismally in recent times. Is there a Christian future? Jesus said of his followers "I have come that they might have life and have it to the full". In order to promote such life it is vital that those of us who are secure in our faith have a very real understanding of the struggles of those who are damaged or wounded. This is not a time for preaching or lecturing but an opportunity to reach out to others in a spirit of welcome and acceptance. And finally to say sorry and to really mean it by making restitution in every way possible."
