'I AM THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD'

The winter solstice was 20 June. We have turned the corner. The days are getting longer. Back on 11 April we celebrated the Easter Vigil. In fact, due to COVID, we viewed it online. The ceremony begins with the 'Service of Light'. The Easter Candle is signed, then lit from the Easter fire before being processed into the darkened church and the hymn of Easter joy, the Exsultet is sung. Easter celebrates the victory of life over death. The darkness cannot overcome the light of the Risen Lord. Alleluia!

I had planned to 'sign' and light our Easter Candle when full congregations resumed. However being limited to 100 for the foreseeable future, I think that it is now appropriate to liturgically introduce our 2020 Easter Candle. Besides, this weekend we are introducing votive candles in the recess adjacent to the statue of Our Lady and in front of the windows of saints. The Easter Candle and votive candles are very much connected. The former is a part of our liturgy or public worship, the latter a time honoured expression of personal devotion. The Church understands personal devotion being inspired by and leading back to the liturgy, especially the Mass ('Directory on Popular Piety and the Liturgy', 2002, n. 58). I commend to you an article available in the foyer, 'A History of Votive Candles', by Fr William Saunders, Virginia USA.

In essence, a candle attracts our eyes as it dispels darkness and affords us purpose and hope as we move forward. As Jesus proclaimed, "I am the light of the world; anyone who follows me will not be walking in the dark; he will have the light of life" (Jn 8:12). The parables in today's Gospel affirm as much with their stress on the kingdom being "essentially future; it is not yet something one can 'possess'. People who really catch a glimpse of it from Jesus' preaching know they have come on a treasure that will fulfil lifelong desires and aspirations. He cannot yet 'deliver' it to them or place them within it but the glimpse of it that he communicates fills them with such joy that they have the freedom to 'sell all' in order, one day, to gain it" (Brendan Byrne SJ). As the attraction of the kingdom relativises everything else, detachment from lesser lights is proper to the disciple. The light of Christ enlightens all and calls for transformation, akin to that sought by Solomon who chose not riches but a discerning heart that he might know and do God's will (First Reading). In our Second Reading St Paul speaks of what Brendan Byrne SJ refers to a as "an inexorably unfolding divine plan that is already underway". The unfolding light of Christ is both cosmic yet very personal. Might our Easter Candle and possibly a votive candle afford us new purpose in the midst of a pandemic and whatever else darkens our horizon. Might they also inspire us to pray for and to be that light for others, as were Mary, 'the first disciple', and all the saints.

If the places are not available you will be notified and asked to consider an alternative Mass. There is no need to register for a weekday Mass.
