TO BE SERVED AND TO SERVE

Singer-songwriter Bob Dylan got it right: "You're gonna have to serve somebody/Well, it may be the devil or it may be the Lord/But you're gonna have to serve somebody." Today we conclude the Church's liturgical year honouring the king who serves. In church-speak we say he served us in our need, true to the Father's will. Jesus is the revelation of the outreach, the hospitality of God. Instituted in 1925, sixteen hundred years after the Council of Nicea's proclamation of Jesus as one person with a human and a divine nature, this feast affirms a servant-king (think of King David) or one who serves like a good shepherd (cf today's Responsorial Psalm), in contrast to those rulers who failed to serve (First Reading). To follow Jesus is to do as he did; serve or extend the hospitality of God. Today's Gospel is the third parable of Matthew 25 addressing how the faithful should act as they await the Lord's return and judgement. To be clear, "the final outcome of one's existence is irreversibly determined by the attitude one takes towards fellow human beings here and now. Nothing is said about correctness of faith, or the need to be free from or have obtained forgiveness for all kinds of sin. The sole determinant is whether one has acted with active care

and compassion for other people in various situations of need... There is no need to wait for the Son of Man to come in judgement; every time one encounters a fellow human being in need one already stands before the Judge and King" (Brendan Byrne). Some Scripture scholars now question that interpretation (cf. Daniel Harrington). They insist that judgement will be on how one responded to the messengers of the Good News of Jesus. To reject them is to reject the one they proclaim, Jesus the Christ. Perhaps one can, indeed must, reconcile the two interpretations through the notion of hospitality: our acceptance of God's hospitality and nurture of us in the Sunday Eucharist and in turn our outreach or offer of hospitality to the broken Christ in the needy? For a whole variety of reasons we will respond to God's hospitality and, or offer hospitality, or we simply withdraw and wither. "You're gonna have to serve somebody." Life calls for a response. "Who you gonna serve?"
