ADVENT: LOOKING FORWARD AND LOOKING BACK

"Are we there yet?" That question will be asked of many parents over the coming holidays. During the four weeks of the Advent Season we are called on a journey too. Initially, the call is to prepare for the Lord's return or second coming at the end of time. Then the Church turns our focus to prepare for his first coming, which we celebrate at Christmas. In Christ's life, death and resurrection we have been reconciled to God "but as far as the outward conditions of present existence go we still have much to long for . . . [including] the achievement of a decent human existence for the majority of human beings" (Brendan Byrne). As the people of the Old Testament longed for the first coming of the Messiah, we now long for the Messiah's second coming or the full realisation of what the Messiah's coming heralded. In summary, we can say the kingdom of God is a present reality but not yet fully realised. Today's Gospel calls for the servant to stay awake and be ready to welcome the master. Where and how am I called to 'be awake' and make present the light and life we long to welcome in its' fullness? That is a very personal question but the liturgy and more especially the candles of our Advent Wreath are a symbol of waiting in founded hope for the dawning light. The symbols on our Jesse tree call to mind God's fidelity to the people of the Old

Covenant as they waited in hope for the one born of the line of David, from the root of Jesse. So too the images of the pregnant Mary on the overhead call to mind her trust and God's hope to be born anew in our lives. The St Vincent de Paul Christmas Appeal box is for the receipt of non-perishable food items for local distribution, a tangible sign of hope. We are a people on a journey of founded hope because our loving God has been and is faithful. With Mary we say 'yes' to his call, walking with her in faith and manifesting love in action. We are not there yet but we are on the way hopefully.
