PROPHETS NOT MESSIAHS

The other morning I watched a caterpillar move with that backward-forward motion to the edge of our back porch. Would he/she go over? At the edge the caterpillar stopped, as if no way, go back. But then the intrepid caterpillar returned to move about a quarter of the way over, surveying the drop of some three metres and deciding to move away finally, to become a butterfly flying free hopefully. Perhaps God looks on us journeying and hopes that we too choose that which is life-giving? We are hard-wired for God and there is a deep down dis-ease or disquiet if we thwart or burden ourselves or others. Our Gospel reading today and for most of this Year B is from Mark. Tradition has it that Mark was a companion of Peter in Rome and his Gospel reflects the teaching of Peter. Addressing a peasant audience in the main, John the Baptist speaks of remission of debts (translated as 'remission of sins'), as did Jesus, "forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors" (Matt 6:12; Lk 11:4). This was good news to peasants who could be subject to taxes of up to 40 percent of production (John J Pilch). Of course, debts or burdens are not only monetary in character; we are often morally burdened or weighed down by choice and, or circumstance. To prepare a way for the Lord's coming? While we might begin with where we have burdened ourselves and seek the balm of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, so too

we need to be watchful and willing to unburden others weighed down by our individual or collective actions or their personal choice, and, or circumstance. Like John the Baptist we are not the Anointed of God, the Messiah but we can be prophets of his coming.
