TO LISTEN AND TO RESPOND

We baulk at change. If present circumstances are to our advantage, chances are we will oppose change. The latter understanding saw the Pharisees send their representatives from Jerusalem to question John about his baptising in the Jordan. Was John a threat to their status? Up front, they saw that his lifestyle and appearance were at odds with his father Zechariah, a rural priest. So, he does not respect family and tradition! Further, and reflecting the early Church's desire to downplay John's role in relation to that of Jesus, our Gospel has John insist that he is not the Messiah, and neither is he Elijah returned or one like Moses who would herald the Messianic age. Rather he is a *"voice crying in the wilderness"*. John's baptism was one of repentance in preparation for the coming of the Messiah, mindful that baptism or purification by water was common in Judaism and other traditions of antiquity. In other words, John is not the main character; he will play his part and then exits stage left. For now the religious authorities are satisfied that John is no more than a 'lone ranger' and no threat to them. However, as John notes, the religious authorities would not recognise the one who *"stands among you . . . the one who is coming after me"*. When Jesus began his public ministry, he took the words of Isaiah from our First Reading to indicate the nature and scope of his mission. He called to true freedom by conversion of mind and heart. In time, the religious authorities who questioned John saw that Jesus threatened the status quo. In collusion with the political authorities, they were to do away with him. However, before we too quickly dismiss the religious and political authorities as the 'bad guys', might we not ask ourselves whether we recognise Jesus standing amongst us and calling us to a change of mind and heart? *"If the message proclaimed by the Church is not in some sense a message of freedom, as well as a summons to conversion, then it has failed to be truly 'Gospel' (Brendan Byrne SJ).* The Gospel either inspires or leaves us indifferent. Besides John the Baptist, another person who heard and responded to the movement of God's Spirit before exiting stage left was Joseph, the husband of Mary and the foster-father of Jesus. Pope Francis reflects on this righteous man in his most recent Apostolic Letter (copies available in the foyer). *"Often in life, things happen that we do not understand. Our first reaction is one of disappointment and rebellion. Joseph set aside his own ideas in order to accept the course of events and, mysterious as they seemed, to embrace them, taking responsibility for them and making them a part of his own history. Unless we are reconciled with our own history, we will be unable to take a single step forward, for we will always remain hostage to our expectations and the disappointments that follow." Fr John*

COVID UPDATE: With the parish having the CBR app and social distancing reduced from four to two (2) square metres, a congregation of up to 250 is permitted in Holy Trinity. This will increase to 300 with extra seating for the 9pm Vigil and 8am and 10am Christmas Day Masses; the 6pm Vigil on the school basketball court (sanctuary) and grass (congregation on rugs or folding chairs) will cater for up to 500. In the church, you can sit in any pew but social distancing must be respected. For Christmas Masses attendees will be 'counted' as they enter the church, until and if the permissible total is reached. We have opted for counting-in as previous calls for registration via trybooking.com.au or phoning the Parish Office received a very poor response. ALL must sign in before entering the Church or to attend the outside Christmas Eve Mass.
