THE WORD OF GOD

Today is 'The Sunday of the Word of God'. It is an initiative of Pope Francis aimed at furthering our appreciation of God's Word. "A day devoted to the Bible should not be seen as a yearly event but rather a year-long event, for we urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the Risen Lord, who continues to speak his word and break bread in the community of believers" (Congregation for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments, 17 Dec 2020). Copies available in the foyer. The Bible is the most published and read book in history. Last month YouTube's 'The Bible in a Year' topped the digital download chart. An English reviewer noted that the effervescent Fr Mick "was a splendid advert for the modern US Catholic Church" but Brits might find it all "a shade too theatrical" (DJ Taylor, 'The Tablet'). The Bible is in fact a library of books of varied literary styles produced over a period of about 1100 years. It is the inspired Word of God, written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. The Bible teaches religious truths as it speaks to and enlightens the human condition. It calls for guidance to appreciate the related and unfolding story of salvation that continues in and through the Church and finds resonance in all peoples of good will. The Bible is our story proclaimed in our public worship or liturgy, especially the Sunday Eucharist or Mass. At the same time, meditation on a Bible passage can afford the individual deep personal awareness and engagement. Today's Gospel sees Jesus continuing to cure in Capernaum. The setting is culturally determined but a perennial religious truth is manifest. "Undoubtedly, we find in the Gospels generally and in Mark, in particular, the attribution to demonic possession of many conditions that modern medicine would prefer to ascribe to various kinds of psycho-physical pathologies. There is no good reason to suppose that the Galilean towns and villages where Jesus laboured were any

more prone to cases of true demonic possession than is the case today. The Gospel highlights the demonic, not only because its author attributed many more conditions to that cause than we would, but also out of the desire to portray all Jesus' activity — whether teaching, healing or exorcising — as a life-and-death struggle with the powers opposed to God for the freedom and enhancement of human life" (Brendan Byrne). As Jesus confronted evil or all that binds, so must his followers. Besides, compare and contrast the freedom that comes in doing so as opposed to a life of mere drudgery (First Reading). Drawing on the graced insights of the human sciences and acknowledging that evil can at times be 'in your face' and at other times ever so subtle and insidious (think physical, verbal and psychological violence), where am I being called to freedom and new life in Jesus?
