EXCLUSION CAN BE DEADLY

Exclusion hurts. In fact, to be put outside the community can be a living death. The understanding of our ancestors in faith was that 'holiness' included bodily wholeness (First Reading, cf. Lev 21:16-20). Disease and deformity could have devastating consequences for the unfortunate individual. For Mediterranean cultures, more gregarious and tactile people than ourselves, the pain of separation was intense. In our Gospel a leper approaches Jesus in the belief that he can cure him and restore him to community. Jesus is moved with deep compassion and reaches out to him. Both have broken taboos; the leper for approaching Jesus in faith and Jesus for touching him and thereby risking the pollution of the community. However, Jesus, in what is known as the divine or theological passive voice, *"Be cured!"* acknowledges God as the one who effects the cure he wills (John J Pilch). Contrary to the cultural understanding *"uncleanness does not flow from the man to Jesus; 'cleanness' flows from Jesus to the man. 'Uncleanness', for Jesus, is not something human beings 'catch' like a contagious disease [but] ... a moral condition [that] has to do with dispositions - good or evil – of the human heart (cf Mark 7:14-23). True 'cleanness' or holiness is something human beings 'catch' like a contagious disease [but] ... a moral condition [that] has to do with disposition, to approach Jesus" (Brendan Byrne). While scholars think that the man's skin complaint was more likely psoriasis than leprosy, the fact is that it excluded him. Whatever about that, we still use the designation 'leper' to refer to one ostracised from community. Racial discrimination creates 'lepers'. Last week Eddie McGuire resigned as*

President of the Collingwood Football Club after 22 years service for comments that were seen to be racially insensitive. During the week, the 2020 Mapping Social Cohesion Report found majority support by Australians for multiculturalism was offset by discriminatory attitudes towards people of Iraqi, Sudanese and Chinese-Australian background. Again last week, the Vatican's Academy for Life released a short document entitled *"Old Age: Our Future. The Elderly After the Pandemic"*, noting that by 2050 one in every five people in the world will be over the age of 60. The academy *"appealed to every facet of society, including families, health care providers, city administrators and local parishes to be more attentive to and inclusive of older people, reviewing and rebuilding the way they welcome and care for people in their frailty" (Carol Glatz CNS).* Today's Gospel calls us to draw close to Jesus, acknowledging our divisive attitudes or experience of prejudice (pre-judgement). In him that which divides is reconciled. In him attitudes and actions bespeaking human respect and inclusion for all are nurtured.
