HAPPINESS IS AN INSIDE JOB

"Spirituality is concerned with how to live a full life, not an empty one. The fact is that all we have in life is life. Things - the cars, the houses, the education, the jobs, the money - come and go. They turn to dust between our fingers eventually. They change and disappear. The gift of life, the secret of it is that life must be developed from the inside out. What we bring to it from within ourselves, not what we collect or consume as we go through it. Not even what we experience in the course of it. It is not circumstances that make or destroy a life. Anyone who has survived the death of a lover, the loss of a position, the end of a dream, the enmity of a friend, knows that. It is the way we live each of the circumstances of life, the humdrum as well as the extraordinary, the daily as well as the defining moments, that determines the quality of our lives. Yet each of has the latitude to live life either well or poorly. Ironically enough, it is a matter of decision and the decision is ours. Time presses upon and tells us we are too busy to be contemplative, but our souls know better. Souls die from lack of reflection. Responsibilities dog us; tell us we are too involved with the real world to be involved in the spiritual questions. But it is always the spiritual questions that make the difference in the way we go about our public responsibilities" Sr. Joan Chittister, 'Contemplation in the Midst of Chaos – Program 453' (emphasis added). The thoughts of Sr Joan could not be more timely. In Lent we are being called to 'repent' (today's Gospel), that is, to realign or refocus our lives. Lent for the Church universal arose from the time of those preparing to be baptised and for those who were being reconciled with the Church after acts of public penance. It is

still a time of proximate preparation for those to be received into the Church at Easter. For the millions already baptised it is meant to be a time of renewal through prayer (personal encounter with God), fasting (self-denial), penance (making amends), charitable acts (outreach) and financial support ('alms giving') for worthy causes (cf. Project Compassion boxes or envelopes in the foyer). The forty days of Lenten renewal, akin to Jesus' 40 days in the desert, prepare us for the celebration of new life of Easter and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit (Pentecost). May this graced season find us receptive.

Lenten Discipline: To assist our renewal, the Church calls for Ash Wednesday and Good Friday to be days of fast (for those aged over 18 and up to 60) and abstinence from meat (for those aged 15 and older). Other Fridays of Lent and the rest of the year are days of penance. The obligation is fulfilled through abstinence, fasting, prayer or works of charity. Each year Catholics are obliged to receive Holy Communion between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday. Lent is the most appropriate season for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Extra times for the sacrament will be duly noted.
