REFLECTING THE LIGHT

In the British Museum is a baked clay cylinder found in the ruins of ancient Babylon. On it is inscribed: "I am Cyrus, king of the world, great king, powerful king, king of Babylon, king of the four quarters of the earth" Cyrus was king of Persia (559 – 530 BC), ruling out of modern day Iraq over the then largest kingdom in the world, stretching from the Mediterranean to Central Asia. He was admired as the ideal king, inspiring Alexander the Great and Julius Caesar ("Conversations" Podcast, ABC, 19 Jan 21). As related in our First Reading, Cyrus conquered the Babylonians (539 BC) and allowed God's exiled people to return to their homeland. They were overjoyed at their liberation in which they considered Cyrus to be the instrument of God. However, the liberation of Cyrus was but a precursor to liberation for all who would look to the one crucified and risen (John 3:16). In John's Gospel 'the world' refers to all who refuse to believe in Jesus. They have preferred darkness to the light of Jesus because their deeds were evil (Jn 3:19). Indeed, in the face of a naivete regarding the openness of folk to the message of Jesus, Scripture scholar Raymond Brown insisted that "the world is not exclusively neutral, nor is it patiently awaiting good news. There are many who are actively hostile to Jesus, to Christianity and its message" (John J Pilch). And many are searching too. One such was

the Pharisee Nicodemus. His encounter with Jesus at night and therefore in private is the backdrop for today's Gospel. Nicodemus figuratively moves from night to day when he later insists on Jesus' right to a hearing when his colleagues wanted him arrested after his teaching in the Temple. The movement of Nicodemus to discipleship seems complete at the death of Jesus. "Nicodemus comes forward publicly with myrrh and aloes to anoint the body. He joins Joseph of Arimathea, a secret disciple of Jesus who feared the Judeans, and both of them see to the burial of Jesus' corpse" (19:38-42). I am neither the all-powerful Cyrus nor the circumspect Nicodemus but during Lent I am called to turn, 'to repent', so as to more truly project the light of Christ. As my faith is lived in community, others might be thereby encouraged to begin or to perhaps continue their search for the light. If not you, who? If not now, when?
