NOT THERE YET

I have been asked, "How was your Easter Father?" I replied along the lines of "Great, but tiring", as if it is all over. It isn't. We are in the Easter Season. In fact, we are only now coming to the end of the Octave or eight days of Easter. And the Season of Easter continues for another six weeks until Pentecost. So my response indicating 'been there, done that' was true with respect to Holy Week-Easter celebrations but misleading about to the Church's understanding of Easter as a season and ongoing experience. If we were to live the story of Easter and see to the needs of all, as did the early Jerusalem

community (First Reading), we might enact the equivalent of a sabbatical year when the burden of crippling debt was remitted for the common good (Deut 15:4). Speaking to this week's World Bank and International Monetary Fund virtual meetings challenged by the pandemic, Pope Francis questioned the possibility for economic recovery when a small minority own half of the world's wealth. Besides calling for debt relief in Africa, and true to the maxim of not wasting a crisis, Pope Francis suggests that to emerge from this situation the better, we need "new and creative forms of social, political and economic participation, . . . sensitive to the voice of the poor and committed to including them in the building of our common future" (CathNews, Fri, 9/4/21). A pipedream you say. History would be on your side. Indeed, the Jerusalem Church's idyllic 'having all things in common' experience was in time only sustained in monasteries. Nonetheless, if we foster a sense of being siblings in God's family (Second Reading), what might be possible if that sense of connectedness was inclusive of all peoples? Perhaps the cynical realist identifies with Thomas and says, "It is not possible!" However, on the eighth day after the Lord's resurrection, Thomas was transformed after encountering him, wounds and all (Gospel). "At this climatic moment of the Gospel it is Thomas, the late-comer, the obtuse one, the doubter who proclaims the full identity of Jesus" (Brendan Byrne). While we are deemed to be 'blessed' for having greater faith than that of Thomas, are we willing to acknowledge the wounded yet Risen Lord in our brokenness and in the brokenness of others? The Lord seeks to transform or redeem all. Easter can be just a memorial, some chocolates and a break. Or it can be a call into deeper engagement. Our journey as a pilgrim people continues. Fr John
