TO CHANGE OFTEN

"In another world it is otherwise, but here below to live is to change, and to be perfect is to have changed often"-Cardinal Newman (1801-1890). St Paul changed dramatically on the road to Damascus. The early church had to change its' attitude to Paul, their former persecutor (First Reading). Our Second Reading speaks of "real and active" love as the fruit of change in Christ. In the Gospel Jesus speaks of the need for pruning or change. In this Easter Season we are called to walk into the future in the light of the Risen Christ. Christ is both the Alpha and the Omega or as Franciscan Fr Richard Rohr puts it, "the Divine Radiance at the Beginning Big Bang and the Divine Allure drawing us into a positive future" ('The Universal Christ', 2019, 95). When Jesus called us to 'repent', he was calling us his disciples to a 'change of mind', a change of outlook. However, we are reluctant to change. Too often, we reduce that call to a moralising change of a few externals while maintaining a self-referential worldview. We do not really change, and we find ourselves needing more and more of what is not working! St Augustine reflected: "A temporal thing is loved before we have it and it grows worthless when we gain it, for it does not satisfy the soul . . . but

the eternal is more ardently loved the more it is acquired. . . . The soul will find the eternal even more valuable after once tasting it" (87). Yet, and this is good news, following the incarnation (or God becoming one-with-us), the eternal is present in the material. Can we see anew and work for balance and harmony? To do so would be to change and to change often. Besides, change or resurrection and renewal is the observable pattern of everything. "True Christianity and true science are both transformational worldviews that place growth and development at their centres. Both endeavours, each in its own way, cooperate with some Divine plan, and whether God is acknowledged may not be that important" (p. 100). God works from within and in secret. To recognise that will call for change. The fruit of that change will be a peace that lasts. Fr John
