MOTHERS: CO-CREATORS AND SOURCE OF BLESSING

Some occasions are good and true. Mothers' Day is such a time. It enriches all of us to celebrate the gift of motherhood. **To all mums:** *"Happy Mothers' Day!"* Mothers are or have been the most important person in the lives of many children. Motherhood is not without challenges. *"An ancient image of the church is the pelican which draws its own blood to feed its young. Many mothers can relate to that image. Motherhood is seldom a painless experience" (Michael McGirr). Motherhood is not notional; it is real and active. It is love in action. It is the type of love called for in today's Gospel. This love is inclusive of all. We, all of humanity, are called to share in God's love. Mothers share that love first and foremost with their family. The blessings given and received there are an inspiration to share that love beyond. In the fourteenth century Julian of Norwich wrote the first book written by a woman in the English language, <i>'Revelations of Divine Love'*. In a timeless manner and despite the darkness in

Perhaps Julian took her inspiration from what John's Gospel emphasises, namely, that God in Christ took flesh and all has been changed or born anew. Julian referred to Christ as "our mother entirely in everything" and "God is as truly our Mother as he is our Father". May all mothers and all who have mothered us be blessed for their sharing the life of God.
