## THE POWER OF ONE IN DIVERSITY

The Solemnity of the Holy Trinity is a timeless mystery with immediate consequences. The doctrine as such only took shape through theological reflection after the New Testament era. In the Old Testament God's self-revelation as creator (Book of Genesis) is followed by God's choice of a people (First Reading). In the New Testament the radical presumption of Jesus in addressing God as "Abba – the informal address to the male parent in Aramaic (= "Dad")" (Brendan Byrne), sees his disciples develop an awareness of being God's sons and daughters and therefore co-heirs with him to eternal life (Second Reading). 'In Christ' and under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, our helper and guide, we continue Jesus's outreach to all (Gospel). It is as if the Scriptures parallel human development in the movement from infancy (creation), to self-awareness (call and nurture) and then to outreach (mission), all of which is founded on God's self-revelation as Creator, Saviour and Sanctifier or Father, Son and Holy Spirit, one-yet-three. Pope Francis would have it that to share in the mission of Jesus requires us to be 'good news' individually and collectively. We are called to communal worship and personal prayer seeking God's will and the grace to carry it out. This is the hope for Australia's Plenary Council. Many here and abroad will be watching and waiting for the discerned outcomes. Again, Pope Francis has called for the 2022-2023 Synod of Bishops to address 'synodality' or what it means for the

baptised to 'walk together' in discerning God's will. Pope Francis has insisted that sharing in the mission of Jesus calls us to 'a consistent ethic of life' or an 'integral ecology', founded in right relationship with God, ourselves, others and all of creation (cf. encyclical 'Laudato Si (2015), see below). We often fall short of our vision and need to seek forgiveness and start afresh. We experience this first hand in the blessing of married love and the family or 'domestic church' and basic unit of society (cf. the encyclical 'Amoris Laetitia' (2016), see below). Again, Pope Francis opposes the termination of life at its beginning (abortion) or before its natural end (euthanasia) and insists on the need for environmental sustainability. As with the Blessed Trinity, it is all connected. Our mission must be inclusive and lifegiving for such is God's self-revelation as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
