TO GATHER, TO REMEMBER AND TO ENGAGE

Today's Solemnity of Corpus Christi is about our nourishment as a pilgrim people. We are on the journey. We are not there yet. We come to Sunday Eucharist or Mass 'as we are'. Hopefully, we leave nurtured, more aware, more reconciled and more willing to be engaged. Sunday Eucharist is the 'source and summit' of our lives. We need to gather. We need to celebrate in memorial of what Jesus did and in anticipation of the heavenly banquet. We give thanks that we can gather. It is a graced time. However, many in Australia and around the world are not able to gather each week as we do. Indeed, Australia's early history is revealing.

"The first authorised public Roman Catholic Mass was celebrated in Australia on this day in 1803. The priest was Fr James Dixon, an emancipated convict who had been transported in 1800 for his involvement with Irish political causes. His permission to say Mass was withdrawn the following year following an uprising among mainly Irish political prisoners at Castle Hill and it was then another sixteen years before Mass was celebrated in the colony again. In 1817, Fr Jeremiah Flynn said Mass in secret near Sydney

Cove, now known as Circular Quay. Catholicism was still banned in England at the time and Mass was not officially sanctioned until the arrival of Fr Therry in 1820. Therry was tolerated because his ministry was thought to help improve law and order among his congregation. Most of the Catholics in the young colony were convicts. Even the free Catholics were to be found at the lower end of the socio-economic spectrum. Catholicism in Australia had a rocky start. For almost forty years, it was kept alive by a small group of lay people for whom their faith was worth taking risks. The Eucharist is evidence of God's commitment to the excluded. This is true of every celebration of the Eucharist, but in the early days of Australia it was plain to see. The Eucharist is a source of hope for hungry people."
