BE ATTENTIVE, BE PREPARED

The motto of the Boy Scouts is 'Be Prepared'. As a Boy Scout, I understood it to mean be ready to assist where you can. Similarly, Mary MacKillop exhorts us to address needs as they present. So too today's Readings call us to be attentive to the Lord's coming. This call to attentive waiting and expectation is reflected in our First Reading from the Book of Wisdom. We are exhorted to be seekers of wisdom. We will not be disappointed. "Even to think about her is understanding fully grown; be on the alert for and anxiety will quickly leave you." To seek the wisdom of God is to be attentive to the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is for this reason that Pope Francis' prayer request for November is for our prayers. "Your prayer gives me strength and helps me to discern and accompany the Church, listening for the Holy Spirit." Our Gospel compares and contrasts the wise and the foolish bridesmaids. The wise have brought sufficient oil for their torches. The unwise have not. They await the bridegroom who will take the bride to his home. Scripture scholar Brendan Byrne comments: The five wise and five foolish bridesmaids represent members of the Church, who, as so often in Matthew, are of mixed quality. The oil represents the kind of good deeds that Jesus commends — "justice, mercy and faith" (23:23) - and which will be so graphically illustrated in the concluding parable of the Great Judgement (25:31-46). The five foolish bridesmaids represent the kind of believers depicted towards the

close of the Sermon on the Mount: those who cry out, "Lord, Lord" but have not good works to accompany this confession of faith (7:21-27). The wise may "sleep" (in death) before the coming of the Lord but when he does come they will go out to meet him with the 'lamps" of their good works shining (cf. 5:16). Thus, the final warning about "staying awake" because neither "the day or the hour" is known really means, in the light of the parable, "Be prepared", rather than "stay awake". Byrne goes on to contextualise the parable for us. He notes that at the end of Mass we are sent out with the words, "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord". We are being directed to live the two-fold command of love of God neighbour (Matt22:37-40). "Those who take them to heart have always with them the "oil" required for salvation; they can "sleep" without anxiety about being caught short by the Lord's sudden arrival" (ibid). And to be very clear about the relationship between faith and works: We are saved by faith, faith in the mercy of God, and that faith finds expression in both our worship and relationship with others, especially those most in need. "You don't get to heaven without a reference from the poor."
