FOCUS – SILENT AND ACTIVE

I have an interest in sport. My sporting prowess was never great but I would 'ave a go'. During the week I went to the National Library's 'GRIT AND GOLD' exhibition of the history of Australian sport. Much of it recalled images, faces and achievements I knew of. Of course, I also learned. I learnt that pedestrianism (competitive walking) was very popular in the early days of the colony, that women's cricket in Australia dates back to 1874, (how good is women's sport at present!), that our first world champion was the sculler Edward 'Ned' Trickett (1876), and that organisers of the 1956 Melbourne Olympics accepted the suggestion of John Wing, a 17 year-old Chinese-Australian apprentice carpenter that a parade of athletes (not nations) symbolising global unity should close the Olympics; the practice has continued. We can always learn more. We are sponges for knowledge and engagement. But do we limit the sources of insight and personal growth? A practice common to most religions and one that has taken off anew in our so-called secular age is meditation. "Pause a while and know that I am God" (Ps 46:10). This deeply personal and revealing experience requires one to be attentive in silence. It requires a certain discipline, especially when starting out. In the Catholic tradition one is seeking to be sensitive to the movement of God's Spirit. Meditation is part of the process of discernment which draws on much else besides, for example, 'the signs of the times' (Vatican II). In October Pope Francis will gather with folk from around the world for the Synod on 'Synodality'. They will seek to discern where

the Spirit is calling the Church today. They will draw on the Church's teaching and practice with an openness to new possibilities. This will be an exercise of communal as distinct from personal discernment. In our Frist Reading, the prophet Elijah experiences God in the gentle breeze. Contrast this with the earlier experience of Moses on Mt Sinai where he encounters God in thunder and lightning (Ex. 19:16-20). A new, more gentle awareness of God's presence is emerging. In the Gospel, Peter had initial trust in Jesus but then loses focus and flounders. His circumstance was reflective of the flagging faith of the early Church. So too, we, in different personal and communal circumstances, can have cause to cry: "Lord save me" (14:30). As in sport, so too in our spirituality: stay focused and good things happen.
