TO CHERISH AND TO REMEMBER

Today's Gospel is Luke's account of the Transfiguration. However, today is not the Feast of the Transfiguration nor our parish feast. We will celebrate that on 6 August. Scholars are agreed as to the intent of the Transfiguration but differ as to just what happened. It has been suggested that our Western deference to science and its many benefits has undermined our "capacity for mystical experiences and other experiences of alternate reality that hold an honoured place in Christian tradition and piety" (John J Pilch). Just as we all have had such experiences with a favourite piece of music, a painting, a family celebration, a sporting event, a time of deep intimacy with a friend or in nature, so too the Transfiguration was an intense experience beyond what those present could control. Sensing the company of Moses and Elijah and reflective of the contemporary understanding that their return ushers in the liberation of Israel, Peter concludes that Jesus will usher in the Messianic age and so exclaims, "Master, it is wonderful for us to be here" (9:33). But wait, there is more! "The whole experience moves to a new degree of intensity as a cloud signals divine presence and the voice of God pronounces the true status of Jesus. He is not merely Messiah. He is "my Son, the Beloved", a rank far outstripping that of Moses or Elijah. The divine voice goes on to add, "Listen to him". Listen, that is, to what he has been saying about the direction his ministry will now take and the suffering it will involve" (Brendan

Byrne). Yet the disciples, like us, have short memories. They get caught up in the present and lack perspective. They will abandon Jesus, and in Peter's case deny ever knowing him. With images and news of war and the impact of floods, whatever about our personal circumstances, we too can forget that God is with us; all of us and always. Lent is a graced time to renew our awareness "that divinity is disclosed in humanity; we live the truth that it is the ordinary pregnant with the extraordinary; . . . that it is to the earthen vessels of our own limitations that is given a treasure more precious than gold" (David Ranson). Or as Pope Francis would have it: "We are called to be contemplatives in action".
