#### NOT AN EASY PEACE

"Peace for our time" declared British Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain in 1938. A year later Nazi aggression shattered that claim with the outbreak of the Second World War. The background to our First Reading is that the prophet Jeremiah in around 558BC called for appeasement of the Babylonians. King Zedekiah's advisers urged aggression. Jeremiah was dismissed. Opposition saw the Babylonians destroy Jerusalem and take the people into exile (578BC). You might conclude, damned if you do and damned if you don't! This brings us to a consideration of the Gospel where Jesus claims to have brought division, not peace. In fact, he was not about a compromised easy peace. Rather the peace he sought to bring was the fruit of a conversion of heart. "Jesus' message does not leave the depths of human beings untouched. Probing beneath a superficial pleasantness and acceptance, it brings deep-seated prejudice, narrowness, and selfishness to the surface, where such negative qualities can be confronted and healed. But many resist challenge and healing at this level" (Brendan Byrne). Increasing hostility to Jesus' words will

**culminate in Jerusalem.** It is only after undergoing his "baptism", that is, of being overwhelmed by his death, and then rising, that he can overcome the hostility to God's love that lurks in the human heart. In that sense he saves us from ourselves and we rightly call him Saviour. He will send the Spirit (cf. "fire" at Pentecost) to continue to transform hearts and minds, the fruit of which is a peace the world cannot give (John 14:27). **His message of transformation in divine love still provokes hostility. Resistance is founded in the inflated claims of ego and pride.** The Gospel concludes with the sobering realisation that families, the best nurturing ground of religious beliefs and values, "can often hold people in prejudices and captivities resistant to the gospel and the following of Jesus. "Peace" is the fruit of Fr John
