LOVE AND FEAR

I wish all mums 'Happy Mother's Day' and trust that you are suitably affirmed and celebrated. People gather for Mother's Day. It is a good time to be with mum and family, or if mum is deceased to remember her fondly. Indeed, in life and in death mum's influence is there in our thoughts, words and deeds. Most memories are cherished, though sadly not for all. Reflecting on presence and absence is most appropriate for today's Readings. Today's Gospel emphasises the abiding presence of Jesus rather than his return. "In contrast to 'the world' (unbelievers), for whom Jesus after his death will cease to exist, believers will 'see' him and 'also will live' in the sense of here and now experiencing his presence in the community and sharing his risen life" (Brendan Byrne). The reason that the early Church and indeed the Church of today is not left orphaned is because of the promise of another Paraclete. When Jesus speaks of 'another Paraclete', "the implication is that Jesus himself has been a 'paraclete' for the disciples" (libid). In other words, the promised Paraclete or Holy Spirit will provide the comfort, assurance and direction that the historical Jesus did. It is on that understanding that believers can have their "answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that is within you (Second Reading). Where love prevails, there is no less than a sharing in the communion of love that God is. "There are only two feelings. Love and fear. There are only two languages. Love

and fear. There are only two activities. Love and fear. There are only two motives, two procedures, two frameworks, two results. Love and fear. Love and fear. . . 'Love one another and you will be happy.' It is as simple and difficult as that. There is no other way. Amen" (Michael Leunig)

ARCHBISHOP'S LETTER RE CALVARY HOSPITAL: Archbishop Christopher has written in unequivocal terms to express his dismay at the decision of the ACT Government to compulsorily acquire Calvary Hospital Bruce. Copies of his letter are available at the exits. The lack of process and rush to enact the decision has bewildered the Little Company of Mary who sought to negotiate in good faith. After not hearing from the ACT Government for six months, they were blindsided with the decision. To be clear: the Little Company of Mary sought to be part of the evolving healthcare in the ACT. Having opened in 1979 under the under the Commonwealth Government as service provider for a Catholic Hospital in Canberra, and so continuing from 1989 under the ACT Government, Calvary has 76 years to run on their current lease agreement. Chief Minister Andrew Barr is reported as saying that religion had nothing to do with the decision. So, what is the basis for the decision to compulsorily acquire Calvary? According to Health Minister Rachel Stephen-Smith "a single network will allow us to better coordinate our health services". Again, as they have for 44 years, Calvary was looking to work with Government in providing for the health needs of Canberrans. Besides, the Government's record on health gives founded basis to question their capacity to deliver on their stated aim. Obviously, this decision raises serious concerns about the ACT Government's transparency and accountability. It also puts on notice other areas of the Church's apostolate in health, social services, aged care and education. You, your friends and colleagues of all faiths and none are encouraged to sign the Archdiocesan 'Save Calvary Hospital Petition' to be presented to the ACT Legislative Assembly.
