#### INTO THE FUTURE TOGETHER

The future. What will it look like? The 'new normal' of the pandemic will continue to challenge. But what of the challenge of housing affordability, to say nothing of the cost of rental properties? What of the wisdom or otherwise of the AUKUS arrangement? What of China looking to other markets for iron ore, the export of which has underwritten our economy? What of the challenges of an aging population and the drying up of migrants? What of the real impact of COVID on small business reliant on cash flow? What of the Vatican calling for a "clear roadmap" from COP26 and not just more platitudes? What of the increasing acceptance of euthanasia and abortion? These are issues pertaining to our common good. The need for leadership and constancy underpinned by an engaged populace is writ large. In the Church too, as evidenced by the Plenary Council. And here we are with Advent beginning at the end of the month and Christmas six weeks away. Many are just looking forward to a break with loved ones. Meanwhile, for many connection via social media is 'as good as it gets' or perhaps another online purchase will alleviate a nagging emptiness? However, today's readings call for a more considered view. We live in community, in relationship. The underlying point is that a day of reckoning is coming. Our First Reading from the Book of Daniel has the bible's first

clear affirmation of the resurrection of the dead. Those who have cooperated with evil, or, in the words of Pope Francis, "not respected the limits love imposes" will rise to what Daniel names as "shame and everlasting disgrace". Those who have lived out of the law of love will rise to everlasting life. **To be clear: we are all a combination of both and God is our judge; thank God! God sees and knows us better than we know ourselves. Nonetheless, there will be a day of reckoning.** Meanwhile, in the face of persecution, the early Church took comfort in the words of Jesus to 'hang in' and trust in God's providence. As with the early Church, so with us: "Things may be dismaying and tough now but the future belongs to God and to the values demonstrated in the life of Jesus, rather than with human forces of death and exploitation. What we do not know is how much longer the struggle must go on. That remains wrapped in God's mystery – even, in Mark's view, for the earthly Jesus ('the Son') himself" (Brendan Byrne) And so trusting in the Lord, we pray: "God give me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I cannot the wisdom to know the difference."
