WHAT LEGACY WILL WE LEAVE?

We continue to pray for the repose of the soul of Cardinal George Pell (1941-2023) and that of his close colleague, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI. A commentator suggested that the Cardinal put the Australian Church on the international stage. Pell's position in the Vatican when accused of child sexual abuse and later acquitted gives credibility to that claim. However, by virtue of his earlier appointments as Archbishop of Melbourne and later Archbishop of Sydney, he already had an international status. In our Second Reading St Paul addresses the followers of Christ as "the church in Corinth" (1Cor 1:2). In church-speak we would today insist that the 'one, holy, catholic and apostolic church' exists in each diocese or archdiocese. The church is both one (or universal) yet present in many ways (or local). The communion of the church universal is manifest in a particular way through the local bishop being in communion with his fellow bishops and the successor of St Peter, Pope Francis, 'the servant of the servants of God'. The title emphasizes that authority in the church is to serve and to enable all the baptised to realise their vocation. Cardinal Pell was his 'own man'. A loyal servant of the Church, his clarity and decisive approach was attractive to some and off-putting to others both within and outside the church. Supporters and opponents were not

lacking in his response to institutional child sexual abuse and his reform of Vatican finances. From all accounts, there was a marked difference between his perceived public persona and engagement with his inner circle. Therein, an authorative presence gave way to a hearty sense of humour and solicitude. "The haters hated with vicious determination and the lovers loved with blindness" (John Ferguson). How should the Church, that is, each of us live our faith? It was to share who God is and who we are called to be that we see Jesus in today's Gospel identify with humanity's need in seeking baptism by John. This was a prelude to his ministry of mercy, healing and reconciliation. That ministry led to the cross and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, under whose direction his followers continue his ministry. In the 14 January editorial of the English Catholic journal 'The Tablet', copies of which are available at the exits, a distinction is drawn between an understanding of God already active in the world and one affirming the unique salvific role of Christ. The former is an emphasis in the writings of Karl Rahner and the latter in those of Hans Urs von Balthassar. I would suggest that that both Pope Benedict and Cardinal Pell were very much in the von Balthassar camp and that Pope Francis, and not without opposition, is seeking to unite the perspectives of both Rahner and von Balthassar. In other words, that the mission has a Church (Rahner) and the Church has a mission (von Batlhassar). This calls for engagement, encounter and dialogue. Hence the call of Pope Francis for 'synodality', founded in the discernment of the movement of the Holy Spirit within and beyond the Church. Cardinal Pell put it very clearly when he said: "I believe that both democracy and religious freedom are at the heart of the good life". Perhaps as disciples of Jesus it is timely for each of us to reflect on what will be the legacy of our words and deeds? Fr John
