EVERY MASS IS A CELEBRATON OF DIVINE MERCY

Pope John Paul 11 declared, and not without controversy, that this, the Second Sunday of Easter is to be known as 'Divine Mercy Sunday'. He was inspired to do so following reflection on the Easter mystery in the light of the visions of Sr Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun. Her visions are not binding in faith. Moreover, the Second Vatican Council affirmed that the liturgy or public worship takes precedence over private devotions. "The popular devotions of the Christian people [...] should accord with the sacred liturgy ... and in some way derive from it, since in fact the liturgy by its very nature is far superior to any of them." This Sunday concludes the Easter Octave but to name it 'Divine Mercy Sunday' can be confusing rather than edifying. Easter (which we celebrated last weekend) is the highpoint of the Church's liturgical year and every Sunday is a memorial of that once-and-for all offer of divine mercy. In other words, Easter Sunday is as good as it gets. Many would claim that the Pope's preference was a 'captain's call'; understandable for him but not binding on the faithful. The Australian Catholic Bishops have noted but not promoted 'Divine Mercy Sunday'. The point to appreciate is that divine mercy is offered to all humanity who often 'miss the mark' or sin. We celebrate this at Easter, every Sunday and whenever we celebrate the Eucharist. For now, we can draw on the reflection of Fr Camilo J. Marivoet. "Eight days after the resurrection the disciples of Jesus were together, afraid, believing and yet doubting, for that Jesus lived was too good to be true. In the same way we have come together today as the community of Jesus. Yet we too are often timid and afraid, filled with questions, perhaps

doubts, with a faith that is fragile. But we are here together because we are a community that believes. We know that the Lord is present is our midst, even though our eyes cannot see him. And with Thomas we say in this eucharist: "My Lord and my God".
