THE SIGN OF NEW WINE

Were Jesus and Mary related to the bride or to the groom? The lofty, beautiful Prologue of John's Gospel - "In the beginning was the Word: the Word was with God and the Word was God . . ." — contrasts with a wedding scene of food, drink and laughter. The truth revealed at the Cana wedding was a 'sign'. The 'signs' of John's Gospel point to the glory of God, understood previously as all-powerful and removed, now being present amongst us in the person of Jesus. Why did Mary prompt Jesus to act? To save the family from embarrassment? Probably. Why did Jesus initially



rebuff his mother? Perhaps he wished to assert his independence? Perhaps he did not want to presume to interfere? Did the compassion underpinning his ministry came to the fore? Whatever, we see here an interplay between cultural and personal sensibilities in which Jesus defers to his mother's request and the 'best wine' results! Culturally, one must bear in mind that it was the bridegroom's role to provide the wine. With reference to our First Reading from Isaiah, we see Jesus fulfilling the role of bridegroom of Israel: "as the bridegroom rejoices in his bride, so will your God rejoice in you." (62:5) A happy wedding and great wine are but signs or a

foretaste of new life in Christ. Indeed, the deepest intimacies of sacramental marriage are but a foretaste of the fullness of relationship we all seek. As good as any relationship might be, it is but a sign calling to a deeper and lasting union in Christ. If we could see all our blessings in the light of our relationship with Christ, we would keep perspective and know a peace the world cannot give. As with the new wine, all is gift. To be received in faith and gratitude. Cheers!

ST JOSEPH VAZ, the 'Apostle of Ceylon', was born in Doha India in 1651. Despite the opposition of Dutch colonial rule, he ministered to secret Catholic communities and worked tirelessly for all during a smallpox epidemic. He died in 1711 and was Canonised by Pope Francis as the first saint of Sri Lanka in 2015. His feast day is today, 16 January.
