TO RECEIVE FAR MORE

Hospitality. It takes time and effort to offer it. It allows folk to enjoy each other's company. All who gather are enriched in different ways. Today's Readings reflect on the hospitality of God, noting that it far outweighs anything we presume to offer. In our First Reading Abraham offers hospitality to three mysterious strangers. The 15th century Russian iconographer Andrey Rublev has depicted the scene with angelic/Trinitarian overtones. Of course, the burden falls on Abraham's wife Sarah to organise the hospitality! Their welcome is reciprocated many times over by the strangers' assurance that Abraham and Sarah will have a child. Again, the Gospel reveals God's generosity. Visiting sisters Martha and Mary, Jesus would have it that while Martha has fussed about preparing many dishes, "Mary has 'chosen the better part' - literally, 'the better portion' (or 'dish')" (Brendan Byrne). Nonetheless, one feels for Martha. She has got on with it while 'dreamy' Mary seems to just be. "But this is where the provocation of the Gospel has its bite. As Luke's Gospel so often makes clear, frenetic service, even service of the Lord, can be a deceptive distraction from what the Lord really wants. Good people are always prone to measure their goodness by all they do for the Lord. They forget that nothing they can ever do could match all they need to receive, and that the Lord's primary intent towards us is to bestow upon us life, love and salvation, rather than to make use of our service" (ibid). Further,

one needs to appreciate the cultural setting of the Gospel. "In the Mediterranean cultural perspective on human activity men are expected to be spontaneous... Women are expected to work, to achieve, to be involved in purposeful activity." John J Pilch would have it that Jesus is counter-cultural in calling men not to spontaneity but rather to "methodical and thoughtful 'doing' of the will of God, keeping the commandments, and so on", and in conversely calling women to spontaneous behaviour rather than the cultural paradigm of doing and achieving. Whatever about that discussion, Richard Byrne is insistent that the intent of the Gospel is the generosity of God and "the barriers that human beings put up against receiving it". Hence the call of the Plenary Council and for each of us to be open in prayer as to where the Spirit is calling before presuming to act in God's name. St Teresa of Calcutta reminds us, "God does not require that we be successful only that we be faithful".
