BEING PART OF THE DIVINE THREAD

In Matthew's genealogy of Jesus which precedes today's Gospel, women feature only four times. "Tamar, whom Judah violate: Rahab, who had been a prostitute; Ruth, the Moabitess; and the wife of Uriah (Bathesheba), who King David adulterously took to himself. In each case a note of sexual impropriety or irregularity attends the reference - not so much because of what the women themselves have done but because of what has been done to them. The genealogy shows how the divine thread of salvation has run through much unsavoury human history" (Brendan Bryne). It is this background which situates Mary's precarious situation of being pregnant, not through a wilful act but "through the Holy Spirit" (V.18). No one knew this besides Mary, not even Joseph, and under the Mosaic Law the penalty was stoning (cf. John 8:1-11). Joseph, the "righteous" man wants to spare Mary public shame and decides to divorce her informally. "In this he "models" keeping the Law in the way that Jesus will commend, giving priority to values such as forgiveness, mercy and compassion (the "weightier matters of the Law" [23:23])" (Byrne). Then reassured by the messenger of God in a dream, "he took his wife to his home". The child is to be the long-awaited saviour, 'Emmanuel' or 'God-with-us'. "Emmanuel' indicates not so much a fresh name but the role the child is to

have for Israel and the world. In the person of this child, God will be 'with' the people in a unique way... After his resurrection, he will continue to be 'with' his Church in its communal life (18:19-20) and world-wide mission to the end of time (28:19-20)" (Byrne). As we prepare to celebrate the saviour being with us, all of us, might we prepare room in our hearts and minds to welcome him. We give expression to this in our gathering to give thanks at the table of the Lord, around our home tables with loved ones and in our commitment to the well-being of others, especially the most needy.
