MOVING ON IN FAITH, HOPE AND LOVE

We are almost at Christmas. Four candles of the Advent Wreath are lit, one to go. It has been a challenging year for all, especially the elderly. COVID and the desire to gather for Christmas remind us of an abiding truth: we exist in relationship and we need one another. Mary was a teenager when asked to be the mother of God! What did she think and feel after saying 'yes'? We don't know. Meanwhile, her kinswoman Elizabeth is pregnant also. What were Mary's thoughts as she made the hazardous journey up into the hill country to assist Elizabeth? We don't know. However, we do know that there was rejoicing on her arrival. This would have confirmed Mary's act of faith in the promise made to her. Mary's response was the great prayer of the Magnificat. This prayer highlights the underdogs, whom God favours (cf. "Bethlehem Ephrathah, the least of the clans of Judah" in our First Reading). Mary would have got on with assisting Elizabeth, and Elizabeth would have shared the wisdom of her experience, and no doubt they had a few laughs. Sometimes we are subject to challenges and woes that are all too much. Sharing is part of the solution, as is founded hope. The Season of Advent is a Season of Hope. It is a time to slow down and to identify with our deepest longings. It is a time for perspective, a time to prepare for the Messiah's first coming, conscious of his return or second coming. Remember the notion of 'in-between time'? We are not there yet, even if we think we

are on top of Christmas preparations! We walk in faith, hope and love. After losing the 1945 British election Winston Churchill's wife apparently suggested that defeat may well be a blessing in disguise. "Madame, if this a blessing, it is indeed well disguised," he replied. Churchill was back in office six years later. Lord, that I might be graced with the gifts of perspective, hope and humour as I put my trust in you – and like Mary – get on with it. Fr John
