PREJUDICE AND PRESUMPTION

The issues at play between the State of Israel and the Palestinian people are many and varied. The outcome is tragic and the tensions are high. Today's Gospel portrays Jesus re-thinking his mission in view of a non-Jew or Gentile woman outwitting him. But first some background to today's gospel. The preceding verses of Matthew 15 have Jesus clarifying that one becomes unclean or unfit for worship not by failing to perform external rituals, like hand-washing, but by "evil intentions and behaviour that flow from the heart that renders a person unclean" (Brendan Byrne). Having clarified Jesus' teaching on the barrier of ritual cleanliness, Matthew then has Jesus cross a literal border into the Tyre and Sidon region where 'unclean' Gentiles reside. Here Jesus reflects accepted cultural behaviour and ignores the Gentile woman who approaches him in need. The disciples want to be rid of the insistent woman but Jesus says his mission is to the house of Israel. Not to be deterred, the woman kneels before him and pleads, "Lord, help me". Jesus responds with the heartless comment about not feeding dogs with children's food. The woman turns the image against Jesus, noting that dogs eat the scraps that children drop from the table. "'Outwitted', Jesus gives in, agreeing to her request and praising the greatness of her faith. Many

readers of the Gospel will doubtless be troubled by the apparent coldness that Jesus initially displays towards this desperate person. By depicting him acting in such a way, however, the narrative intensifies the sense of the barrier between Jews and Gentiles, only to highlight the significance of what is happening when, as a result of the women's faith, the barrier comes crashing down" (ibid). Our First Reading from Isaiah prefigures the awareness that Jesus came to. When the people of God returned from exile (538 BC), they were confronted with foreigners and neighbours on the land they once called theirs. Isaiah speaks of foreigners identifying with the Lord being brought to the Temple mount. "The privilege of worshipping God is so central to Israel's identity that it is hard to think of a stronger expression of inclusivity than this" (ibid). Religion is mediated through culture. We need to critique attitudes and presumptions that undermine the dignity of all. After all, 'religion' means literally to 'religament' or to reconnect that which presumption and prejudice (sin, if you will) have divided.
