PRIORITISE PERSONAL RENEWAL

We worry about all manner of things: the war in Ukraine, the plight of flood victims, the cost of petrol, possible new strains of COVID, rising inflation, house prices, reconciliation, the plight of displaced persons, church renewal, etc, etc. It is only proper that we do so. These are communal concerns, to say nothing of our personal circumstance. Life happens and it is often not fair. How are we to respond? As he heads towards Jerusalem, Jesus insists that we get our priorities in order. Jesus would have it that the reports of those allegedly killed by Pilate and those who died when a tower fell on them are a timely reminder that we need to look to our personal readiness to face God. Lent is about that, about 'turning around' to renew our focus. If we encounter the mercy and therefore the love of God a sense of justice or 'right living' follows. In the parable of the fig tree (the Chosen People) Jesus insists that it was because the religious leaders were not true to their call and did not prioritise the needs of the people, there is an absence of fruit. Their negligence and the tree's inability to renew itself means that external intervention is necessary. "Throughout the Gospels Jesus, the authentic Mediterranean native, resorts to insults on a regular basis, and they are always gems. The gardener might have proposed new soil for the tree or increased watering. Instead he proposed spreading manure on it. Jesus' original peasant audience undoubtedly roared with laughter. This is just what those

#)%!@ leaders needed!" (John J Pilch). Little wonder the religious authorities saw Jesus as a threat. All of us need to be addressing personal renewal. On St Patrick's Day Archbishop Peter Comensoli of Melbourne delivered the annual Patrick Oration. He claimed that "There is virtually no evidence throughout the New Testament of the Church engaging in the politics of the day or seeking to plant works of the Church in public structures. The focus was personal and familial and communal ... The early Church was a Church that assembled and passed on the faith in family homes." Of course, times change but not the Gospel priority of personal conversion. During Lent it is timely to remind ourselves that: "Dedicated reformers are so often focused on the evils to be exterminated that they neglect the need for personal reform as well. This is true of all of us as it is of leaders" (John J Pilch). Recall the 'plank and splinter' Gospel of a few weeks back. And so again, what personal matters is God's Spirit calling me to sift in his love?
