TRUE STRENGTH, LASTING GOODNESS

The funeral of Queen Elizabeth 11 involved pageantry and tradition. The power and grandeur initially evoked by the title 'Christ the King' is toned down by some scriptural context in our First Reading, 2 Sam 5:1-3. David, appointed king of the previously divided Judah and Israel, is told "You shall be shepherd of my people Israel". You shall not lord it over them. On the contrary, David was called to serve; even to be willing to lay down his life for his people, as Queen Elizabeth understood she was called to do. David was gifted if inconsistent but under his shepherding the People of God knew unparalleled prosperity. Jesus, born of the line of David, beaten and dying on the cross was mocked in the understanding that if he was a king, as the inscription "King of the Jews" above him indicated, then he should be able to save himself and not die as a common criminal. However, a common criminal, the so-called 'good thief' puts his trust in Jesus and is reassured, "Today, you will be with me in paradise". Brendan Byrne comments: "The essence of salvation is not to be saved from physical death, as the mockery had suggested. It is to be "with Jesus", to accompany him on the "exodus" (Luke 9:31) to the Father now under way." The reference to paradise evokes the restoration of paradise lost by the first Adam. It is by this shepherd-king's act of ultimate surrender not the unfettered exercise of power that paradise, the fullness of life in God, is offered to all. St Francis de Sales (1567 – 1622) put it beautifully when he said, "Nothing is so strong as gentleness, nothing so gentle as real strength". That awareness was brought

home to me as I reflected on the life of my sister Sharon who died peacefully on Tuesday morning. Sharon had cerebral palsy and her health had deteriorated over the past few months. A relative expressed it very well when she said, "Sharon was definitely an inspiration to us all, particularly in the way she kept such a positive outlook on life, though there were many challenges. She was always interested in other peoples' lives . . . Sharon never dwelled on what she couldn't do, but what she could do . . . all the while keeping a smile on her face." To so live, and die, is to inspire. May Sharon hear the call into paradise.
