ZEALOUS MOTIVES – LOVING RESPONSE

The Greek philosopher Plato was concerned that writing would see folk fail to memorise and properly hand on wisdom. In today's Gospel, we have the only account of Jesus writing, albeit on the ground. Was he in fact writing? One author suggests that he was more truly doodling. He claims that this was "a common custom amongst Mediterranean peasants when distraught" (John J Pilch). Jesus had good reason to be conflicted. The religious authorities seek his judgement on a woman caught in the act of adultery. He knows the question is an attempt to trap him; the issue is not with the nameless woman but with his response to her situation. Of course, it is noteworthy that the man who committed adultery with the woman is not brought to task though the law called for the killing of both (Deut 22:22). If Jesus says let her go, he is seen not to support the Law and cannot be considered a true prophet. On the other hand, if he says that she should be stoned he is in trouble with the occupying Romans who have taken away the right to capital punishment according to Mosaic Law. Besides, as the crime of adultery required two witnesses, has the husband set a trap for his wife or have his enemies set the trap to shame him? Little wonder Jesus doodled as he considered an appropriate response! After a time he turns the tables and challenges the zealous lynch mob – let the one among you without sin be the first to cast a stone at her. This gives all 'cause to pause'.

They back off, beginning with the oldest or those who have had the greater experience of life's challenges. "Jesus the prophet, the one who speaks the will of God for the here-and- now, reminds them – and all zealots – to strive for purity of motive as they pursue their righteous goals" (Pilch). When all have departed, Jesus is left with the woman. It is noteworthy that he looks up at her. Here is the beloved of God in literally an inferior position to the woman. Recall last week's Gospel how the father ran out to meet his son. Our God comes to us in our need. Jesus looks lovingly at the woman, restoring her in community and in herself as he says, "Go and sin no more". While not as dramatic a context, we pray that our parishioners and those from South Woden and Weston Creek Parishes who gather for this Tuesday's 7pm Second Rite of Reconciliation will have something of that experience.
