ALL SHALL BE WELL

Mary Gilmore's picture is on our ten dollar note. From 1908 until 1930 she edited the Women's Page in the Australian Worker, allowing women to express views that would not be heard otherwise. Gilmore suffered from mental illness but from her depression she learnt compassion for others. In the fourteenth century a thirty-year old woman called Julian of Norwich wrote 'Revelations of Divine Love'. It was the first book written by a woman in the English language. While the sharing of her visions speaks of love and contentment, it would seem that she too suffered from depression. Perhaps her "discovery of serenity on a rocky road is what makes her appealing to people who struggle today. Perhaps it is her clear-sightedness (the real meaning of vision) in a dark world, one in which she said, despite the reality of sin and evil, 'all shall be well and all manner of things shall be well', or again, her seeing that 'God is truly our Mother as he is our Father' (Michael McGirr). Today is the First Sunday of Advent. It is a season of hope. We look forward to the Saviour's return as our ancestors in faith longed for his first coming which we will celebrate at Christmas. God is faithful, such that our hope is not deceptive (Rmns 5:5-11). While we await the consummation of our salvation, the Lord's "grace and power continually knock at the door of our lives, seeking to move us along his way" (Brendan Byrne). This will include a share in his sufferings to overcome sin and evil so as to share in his glory. Attentive

and awake to the Lord's call, we are like the 'doorkeeper' in today's Gospel. "The rest of the world may 'sleep', but we are children of the light and of the day (1 Thess 5:5), our lives bathed in the dawning light of the risen Lord and enriched by the hope of his final coming" (ibid). And yet there is much that challenges our faith, hope and love. During Advent the Parish Liturgy Committee is drawing on the ancient image of the Church as a boat, sometimes storm tossed, sometimes moving in calm waters. Over the weeks of Advent, you are invited to compose and fold a prayer of thanks (yellow paper) and, or a prayer of petition (mauve paper), and place in our stylised boat in front of the altar. The lantern in front of the same reflects the founded Advent hope that 'all shall be well and all manner of things shall be well'.

EUTHANASIA: The Australian Bishops have released a document, 'To Witness and to Accompany with Christian Hope' to assist those journeying with folk considering voluntary assisted dying. Accompaniment is an act of charity which does not require one to suspend commitment to the Church's clear teaching that euthanasia is never morally permissible. Copies available at the exits.
