#### **PESSIMIST OR OPTIMIST**

Either 'glass half-full or glass half-empty' might characterise one's response to the release of the 2021 census data regarding religious affiliation in Australia. 'Half-empty' because for the first time the Christian population is now less than half the total at 44 percent. Catholics make up the largest group of Christians but at 20 percent are down 2.6 per cent from the 2016 census. Those without religious affiliation make up 39 percent of the population. Australia is a more multicultural and less religious society, especially amongst Millennials (typically those born between 1981 and 1996). 'Half-full' because as Archbishop Mark Coleridge noted, "Almost half the population identify as Christian, which means that Jesus is very much part of the mix of the Australian soul... [and while it has] been clear for some time that the Church is no longer the power in the land we once were, [we are still] engaged far and wide in service of the community". This weekend the Second Assembly of the Plenary Council commences in Sydney (3 – 9 July). In the foyer you can find a considered overview of the Council in the article from the English Catholic journal, 'The Tablet' "Australia First and Foremost" (July 2), by Vatican correspondent Christopher Lamb. I am privileged to be a member of the Plenary Council. However, as fate would have it, I am isolating with COVID. Therefore, along with 8 other members who for various reasons cannot be in Sydney, I will be attending online. Please continue to pray for the Plenary Council. Please also prayerfully reflect during this NAIDOC Week (3-10 July) on the past injustices and present aspirations of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander folk in the hope that we all move forward together. You

are invited to take a copy of the two-sided summary paper in the foyer prepared by the National Aboriginal Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC), the peak advisory body to the Australian Catholic Bishops on issues relating to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholics. Fundamental to our consideration of these matters is where is God's Spirit calling you, me, us? While faith is mediated through culture and the first unit of society is the family, a Christian must be marinated in and responsive to the lifegiving movement of the Holy Spirit. What is God's preference? Indeed, as Scripture scholar Brendan Byrne SJ comments: "Today's scripture readings challenge any easy assumption on the part of followers of Jesus that they can be casual about living by the values prevailing in the world around them. If we simply drift in the strong current of those values and forces behind them, we shall surely drift away from the Gospel and the hope that it holds out; we shall not be part of the radical new creation that God is calling into being through the cross of Jesus. As the old slogan goes, Christianity is comforting but not comfortable."
